The registered nursing program is designed to prepare students for licensure and employment as a registered nurse, providing nursing care in a variety of healthcare settings. The four-semester program incorporates interactive face-to-face classes, web-enhanced classes, labs, and clinical experiences to prepare students to function as a member of the healthcare team.

Students must complete all admission criteria and submit a nursing application by the designated deadline before being allowed to start a nursing course in the curriculum. RN student applicants must pass the NLN Pre-Admission Test (PAX) at the 50th RN Percentile Rank or higher ineach section before submitting a nursing application.

Traditional RN students must complete state-tested nursing assistant certification and American Heart AssociationHealthcare Provider CPR certification before beginning the program.

BCI and FBI criminal background checks are required after admission to the program and 6 to 8 weeks before entering the nursing program. A conviction for a misdemeanor or felony may affect a student's eligibility to enternursing or participating in clinical experiences.

Applicant must be 18 years of age to begin the nursing program.

Students are required to complete physicals, immunizations, and drug screens before beginning the program.

Nursing Core Courses must be completed within three (3) years.
