LPN to RN Advanced Standing



This three semester program is designed to prepare the Licensed Practical Nurse for licensure as a registered nurse. Students must meet all admission criteria (Intermediate Algebra, A&P I and II, General Psychology, Human Growth & Development, NLN Test, keyboarding and computer competency) prior to taking the transition course. The program incorporates lectures, labs, and supervised clinical experiences to prepare the student for the role of the registered nurse. Graduates are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN), which allows the graduate to practice as a Registered Nurse.

The Associate Degree Nursing program is fully approved by the Ohio Board of Nursing and accredited by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission, 61 Broadway 33rd Floor, New York, NY 10006, (800) 669-1656, extension 153.

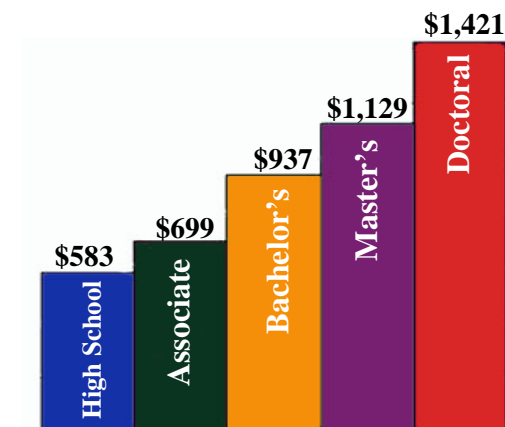
Career Options

Graduates of the AD Nursing Program who wish to specialize in a specific field may continue their education at a four-year college or university to achieve a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree in nursing to practice as a Nursing Administrator, Nursing Educator, Nursing Researcher, Nurse Practitioner, Nurse Midwife, Nurse Anesthetist, or Clinical Nurse Specialist

Students must attain a minimum grade of "C" in all courses to progress in the program and graduate. Students must also demonstrate the ability to be successful on the NCLEX RN exam prior to completion of the program.

NRS211 is considered a validation course and can only be taken one time. Students who are unsuccessful may apply to the two year associate degree program.

Part-time Program

The LPN to RN Advanced Standing Program is also offered at 793 Fox Rd. in Van Wert, Ohio through a unique collaboration between NSCC, Vantage Career Center and Wright State University (Lake Campus). Necessary remedial and all general education courses are offered at the site either by NSCC or Wright State University. All nursing courses are through NSCC.
